MINUTE entry before the Honorable Joan B. Gottschall: Plaintiff's motion [14] for leave to file certain documents under seal and motion [15] for leave to exceed the Local Rule 7.1 page limit are granted. Plaintiff's ex parte motion [9] for temporary restraining order is denied without prejudice because plaintiff has not complied with Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b)(1)(a) requiring that "specific facts in an affidavit or a verified complaint clearly show that immediate and irreparable injury, loss, or damage will result to the movant before the adverse party can be heard in opposition." The requirements of Rule 65(b)(1) for obtaining ex parte relief must be strictly observed. See Am. Can Co. v. Mansukhani, 742 F.2d 314, 322 (7th Cir. 1984). The court has reviewed the two declarations filed in support of plaintiff's motion: the declarations of attorney Brian J. Beck [13–5] and Nicholas Carso [13–1]. Neither declaration purports to contain specific facts justifying proceeding without notice to defendant. Plaintiff argues that ex parte relief is appropriate on pages 7–8 and 21–22 of its supporting memorandum of law [13], but plaintiff cites no affidavit or declaration in support of its arguments. For these reasons, plaintiff's motion [9] is denied without prejudice. Mailed notice(mjc,)
